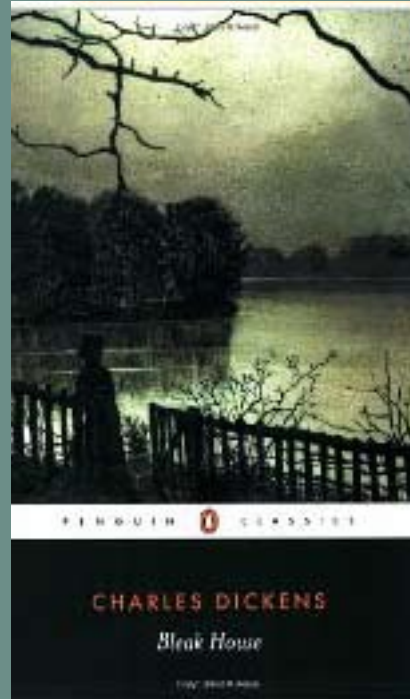
BY CHARLES DICKENS
